Ahead of a key vote on the Assembly floor, the editorial boards of two of California's leading newspapers, the Sacramento Bee and the Mercury News, joined hundreds of organizations throughout California voicing their support for SB 17 (Hernandez).

The endorsements come at an important time in the bill's life cycle. The Assembly floor hearing is SB 17's final obstacle before heading to the Governor's desk for passage into law. If passed, this much-needed transparency law would serve as a model for state governments across the country as they search for viable solutions to pharma's price-gouging tactics.
